Survey Effectiveness

The Point-in-Time survey is an important tool for fighting homelessness. As such, it is important to understand the tool. One metric is the percentage of surveys for homeless persons. Of the total number of surveys collected, fifty-four percent (54%) were for homeless persons (unsheltered and sheltered in emergency shelter on the night of the PIT). Of the total surveys collected, twelve percent (12%) were for unsheltered homeless persons; twenty-two percent (22%) of the homeless surveys collected were for the unsheltered homeless.

The following numbers apply only to the surveys collected on January 25th, 2016 and do not reflect any data within Toledo HMIS.
