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Survey Effectiveness

The Point-in-Time survey is an important tool in the toolbox of fighting homelessness. As such, it is important to understand the tool. One metric is the percentage of surveys for homeless persons. Of the total number of surveys collected, forty-six percent were for homeless persons (unsheltered and sheltered in emergency shelter on the night of the PIT). Of the total surveys collected, one-half percent were for unsheltered homeless persons; eleven percent of the homeless surveys collected were for the unsheltered homeless.

Community Subpopulations

The Point-in-Time Survey gives the community an opportunity to glance outside its borders and to ask questions that normally would not be asked. Two subgroups were included in this year's PIT survey: Previously Incarcerated Persons and Physically Impaired Persons. The following numbers apply only to the surveys collected on January 28th, 2015 and do not reflect any data collected within the Toledo HMIS.
